

RESOLUTION 106 (V)

Scale of Contributions for the Apportionment of the expenses of the Agency for the two-year term 1978-1979

The General Conferences

Stressing the importance of the principle that all Member States of OPANAL must contribute in an equitable form to its support;

Recalling that paragraph 3 of Article 9 of the Treaty of Tlatelolco establishes that:

"The General Conference shall adopt the budget of the Agency and fix the scale of financial contributions to be paid by Member States, taking into account the systems and criteria used for the same purpose by the United Nations",

Resolves:

1. That the scale of contributions of Member States for the apportionment of the expenses of the Agency for the two-year term 1978-1979 shall establish, for the above mentioned two-year term, a maximum of 30% of the budget for the major contributor.

- 2. To reaffirm that the resolution mentioned in the preceding paragraph is a first step in the implementation of the decisions adopted on this matter by the United Nations for the budget of this year.
- 3. To confirm that the final aim is that, on the basis of the criteria adopted by the United Nations, the major contributor shall pay not more than 25% of the OPANAL budget.
- 4. That the scale of contributions of Member States for the apportionment of the expenses of the Agency for the two-year term 1978-1979 shall be as follows:

The General Conference:

Decides to establish a Committee on Contributions and Budgetary Questions, made up of five experts appointed by the countries, who shall remain in office for a period of two years and shall submit a report on matters under their competence based on the resolutions of the General Conference and the proposals submitted by the Secretary-General
