RESOLUTION 142

Control System

Compliance with Article 14 of the Treaty of Tlatelolco

The General Conference,

Bearing in mind that, as has been stated repeatedly, the functioning of the Control System established by the Treaty for the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons in Latin America, is an inseparable whole, and that the provisions in Article 14 of this Treaty therefore must be complied with by the Member States so that the above-mentioned Control System will operate effectively;

Being aware of the fact that complying with the provisions of Article 14 of the Treaty imposes absolutely no practical difficulties on the Governments of the Member States, and

Recalling its previous Resolutions 32 (II), of September 9, 1971; 52 (III), of August 23, 1973; 82 (IV), of April 18, 1975; 100 (V), of April 21, 1977, and 117 (VI), of April 25, 1979, as well as the concern of the Council as expressed repeatedly after Resolution C-3, of November 17, 1970,

Resolves:

To reiterate to the Governments of the Member States its interest in their prompt compliance with the obligations imposed upon them by Article 14 of the Treaty, stressing the need to comply with the terms of both paragraph 1 of said article, by means of the biennial declaration that is prescribed therein, as well as the reports referred to in paragraph 2 of the same article of the Treaty.
