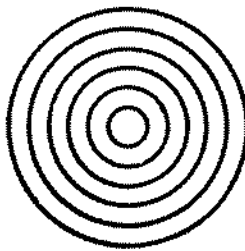

RESOLUTION 227 (X)
SOUTH ATLANTIC PEACE AND COOPERATION ZONE
RELATIONSHIP WITH THE LATIN AMERICAN AND CARIBBEAN
NUCLEAR WEAPONS FREE ZONE

The General Conference,

Recalling Resolution 41/11 of the General Assembly of the United Nations regarding the establishment of the South Atlantic Peace and Cooperation Zone;

Taking into consideration the importance of this Resolution and its necessary link to the aims, objectives and implementation of the Treaty of Tlatelolco and its Additional Protocols,

Resolves:

1. To express its satisfaction for the adoption of the Resolution of the United Nations General Assembly regarding the establishment of a South Atlantic Peace and Cooperation Zone.
2. To entrust the Secretary General, with the collaboration of the Council of the Agency, to prepare an analysis on the relationship between the Nuclear Weapons Free Zone of Latin America and the Caribbean and the South Atlantic Peace and Cooperation Zone, as well as on the rights and obligations arising

from their respective existence and applicable to those countries that conform them as well as to third States.

3. To request the Secretary General to submit the aforementioned analysis for the next Regular Session of the General Conference as part of an additional item entitled: "South Atlantic Peace and Cooperation Zone. Relationship with the Latin American and Caribbean Nuclear Weapons Free Zone".
