The Agency for the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons in Latin America and the Caribbean has received a letter from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Mexico, dated June 23, 1992 with information regarding the status of the Treaty of Tlatelolco.

The information above referred, states that St. Vincent and the Grenadines have signed and ratified the Treaty on February 14, 1992 and has waived its Article 28 on May 11, 1992.

The Minister of Foreign Affairs and Tourism of St. Vincent and the Grenadines sent to OPANAL the contents of the Declaration of Waiver under paragraph 2 of Article 28 of the Treaty of Tlatelolco which is herewith enclosed for information of all State Parties.

**DECLARATION OF WAIVER UNDER PARAGRAPH 2  
OF ARTICLE 28 OF THE TREATY FOR  
THE PROHIBITION OF NUCLEAR WEAPONS IN LATIN AMERICA**

"WHEREAS the Treaty for the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons in Latin America was on the 14th day of February, 1992, signed at Mexico City, Mexico, by the duly accredited representative of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines;

AND WHEREAS the said Treaty has been duly ratified by the Government of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines and the Instrument of Ratification thereof deposited with the Government of the United States of Mexico;

AND WHEREAS the said Treaty provides in paragraph 2 of Article 28 that all signatory States shall have imprescriptible right to waive, wholly or in part, the requirements laid down in paragraph 1 of the said Article 28;

NOW THEREFORE the Government of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines hereby declares that it has waived wholly the requirement laid down in paragraph 1 (d) of Article 28 of the Treaty for the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons in Latin America.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I, Herbert George Young, Minister of Foreign Affairs and Tourism of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, have hereunto set my hand and affixed the seal of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines.

DONE at Kingstown this 26th day of February in the year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety-Two."
